


From the Desk of Pastor Messer

"Will We Observe Lent?"



In a little over two weeks from now, we will begin the season of Lent. Or, will we?

Yes, we'll bring out the ashes on Ash Wednesday; and, yes, we'll pull out the purple paraments for the season; and, yes, we'll have Midweek Services; and, yes, we'll hear all of the familiar readings, including the Passion Account as the season progresses. Rest assured, we will observe Lent here at Peace. But, will we observe Lent? Will you? Will I? Or, will we just go through the motions?

The holy and penitential season of Lent beckons us, my friends, but will we heed its call? Will we accept its invitation to truly examine ourselves, to do some soul-searching and analyze how we're doing in relation to God's commandments? Will we seize the opportunity this season provides for us to recognize more deeply our need for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ? Will we heed its call to amend our sinful lives and re-dedicate ourselves to the faith we confess? These are pointed questions, to be sure, but they are questions each one of us should be asking ourselves.

You see, Lent is faithful. It will not let us down. It comes every year and provides us with the same opportunity to do some much needed spiritual house-cleaning. But, it will do us no good if we do not seize the opportunity it provides. It will avail us nothing if we just go through the motions.

So, how do we seize the Lenten opportunity? Well, the answer to that question will be different for each one of us as we examine ourselves and identify our spiritual shortcomings. But, here is a list of things we would do well to think about:

- 1. Church attendance Obviously, attending Church where the Lord comes to be in our presence and give us His gifts through Word and Sacrament should be a high priority in our lives. Is it? Do we attend as often as we possibly can?
- 2. <u>Bible Study</u> This is another obvious one, for all Christians know the importance of being in the Word of God. Or, at least, they should. Are we in the Word as often as we should be?
- 3. Prayer/Devotional Life How is our prayer and devotional life going? Do we set aside some time each day to spend with the Lord?
- 4. Attention in Church When we attend Service, do we strive to pay attention to the Word in the liturgy, hymns, readings, and sermon, or are we guilty of simply going through the motions?
- 5. Service Are we committed to serving the Lord and His Church with our time, talents, and treasures? Does He get our first-fruits or our leftovers? Are we committed to serving our neighbor or are we too busy taking care of ourselves?
- Confess Do we strive to confess our faith in word and deed, or do we forget we're Christians between Sundays? Do we invite people to the Divine Service, where Jesus is present for us?
- 7. Striving against sin Are there certain sins that seem to have control over us? Do we struggle against them and strive to defeat them, or do we simply throw in the towel and indulge them?

My friends, this short list is, by no means, exhaustive, but it's a good start. The holy and penitential season of Lent provides us with an opportunity to look at these areas of our spiritual lives, examine how well we're doing and, most importantly, to strive to improve where we are lacking. I know there are many areas in which I have much room for improvement. What say you?

It is my sincere hope and prayer that each one of us would truly observe Lent this year, that we would not just let it come and go, but embark on the spiritual journey it invites us to take. It is only as we truly examine ourselves that we will come to appreciate more deeply the salvific work our Savior did to atone for our sins, and then, motivated by that awesome Gospel, strive to lead godly lives. Lent provides us with this opportunity. Will we seize it? I pray we will!



Call to Order: President Coaline Luplow gave the call to order at 7:05 p.m. Those attending were Coaline Luplow, Carol Zeile, Lois Ramsey, Sharyn Greening, Dorothy Trgina, Mary Jakolat, Gretchen Harrison and Pastor Messer.

Secretary Report: The minutes of the December 7 meeting were approved, with a couple of changes (Megan Brown will be asked to meet with the Constitution Committee; The Jakolats loaned their outside wreath for this year only, no permanently).

Treasurer Report: Account Balances. Savings, \$2,355.58; Checking, \$437.55. Cookie Walk and Craft Show. A \$20 table refund and other small expenditures, plus the Care in Congregation Funds received (\$420) increased the revenue raised at the 2009 event to \$2,014.24.

Committee Reports:

- Altar: Carol Zeile. Carol read a portion from the LCMS Altar Guild Manual about the season of Epiphany. Carol also discussed the possibility of leaving the Christmas decorations in place until after the Feast of the Purification of Mary and Presentation of Our Lord, which will be observed on February 3 (all agreed to take the decorations down the following Saturday, Feb. 6). Carol also reported that all the ordered Superfrontals, Chalice Veils, and Book Marks have been received. The Altar Guild now has everything needed for all the Seasons for the entire Church Year.
- **Banner:** Gretchen Harrison. At some point, a banner photo book was assembled and it was presented for viewing. The banners will be inventoried. The present storage area for the banners was discussed, deemed to be inadequate and that a larger area is required. New banners have been purchased and some older banners may be retired.
- **Kitchen:** Coaline Luplow and Lois Ramsey. Sunday morning coffee donations totaled \$41.50, supply purchases totaled \$67.19, and the current fund balance is \$40.73.
- **Library:** Coaline Luplow. No report.
- **Sunshine:** Marlene Miller. No report.
- Special Events: Coaline Luplow and Lois Ramsey. To welcome Kyle and Jilian Stahl, Adult Confirmands, a decorated cake was served during the December 27 fellowship hour.

Other Reports:

- Charitable Donations: Dorothy Trgina. Dorothy produced a flyer that was placed in Sunday bulletins, *The Peace Post*, and member mailboxes, regarding the Baby Layettes to be collected for LWR from January through March. Dorothy showed some diapers she had made from diaper material purchased at JoAnne's Fabrics. It was decided to make it clear to everyone that they may donate individual items toward Layettes and do not have to donate the entire Layette. Dorothy will make sure that info gets out.
- Comments by Pastor: Pastor talked about the Issues, Etc. 300 (300 congregations donating \$1000/yr.). After discussion, a motion by Sharyn, support by Carol, that Ladies Guild contribute \$200 to Issues, Etc. Approved. A discussion ensued about church history and it was suggested that we take note of our annual anniversary as a congregation in the bulletin and newsletter, and that we plan for ways to celebrate our 50th anniversary throughout the year in 2012 (Peace was organized on November 11, 1962 and became a member of the LCMS on March 17, 1963).
- Seminary Student Report: Our current student will graduate in May. A new student will be selected soon.
- **Projects:** Discussed the need for a more spacious area to store our Banners. Also discussed a Prie Dieu (kneeling bench) for Pastor Messer. Both items were tabled for further research to be done.

Old Business:

- Cookie Walk: Coaline presented a final report on the Cookie Walk and Craft Show.
- Acolyte Robes: The Acolyte robes are in bad shape. Carol presented information on new robes. A catalogue was passed around. Sizing is determined by length, and prices vary from \$35.75 to \$41. Motion by Mary, support by Carol, to purchase one robe on approval to determine the quality and sizing of the robes. Approved
- The Constitution/By-Laws The revision committee will meet Monday, January 11 from 6 until 7:30 p.m.

New Business:

- **Ash Wednesday** is February 17. After discussing the Lenten pre-service meals, the ladies decided to replace the usual pot-luck fare with soup and salad. Coaline Luplow will organize. S.A.L.T. and the Youth Group will each be invited to host one of the meals.
- **Guild Hostess:** Lois Ramsey will be hostess for the March meeting
- Christmas decorations: Decorations will be removed on Saturday, February 6, beginning at 10 a.m. No lunch will be served.
- **Recipe Book:** Coaline presented a copy of an attractive recipe book compiled by an area church. Discussion and consensus for Peace Ladies Guild to compile a cook book, with an invitation extended to all members of Peace Lutheran to participate. Some recipes from the Cookie Walk are already collected. Notices will be placed in the Sunday bulletins and in the <u>Peace Post</u>. Recipes can be placed in Coaline's mailbox.

Thank you to Mary Jakolat for serving as hostess for tonight's meeting. The next meeting will be February 1, with Marlene Miller as hostess. The meeting closed at 8:45, with Pastor leading the ladies in The Lord's Prayer.
