#### "A Year in Review"

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:3-6).

Well, it's official—I have now been serving at Peace for an entire year. And, as I think back on this first year, I echo the

words St. Paul wrote to the church at Philippi. I am thankful and filled with joy to be serving all of you as pastor; thankful and filled with joy to be partners with all of you in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. It is a tremendous blessing and an enormous pleasure to be serving here at Peace and I look forward, with great enthusiasm and optimism, to the weeks, months, and years to come!

As a congregation, we have much for which to be thankful. Whether we realize it or not, we are, by God's grace, moving forward and becoming a congregation that not only has a mission statement, but is aware of and making strides to fulfill it. As I share this "year in review" with you, let us join in giving God all the glory, thanking Him for all the blessings we have received.

#### Since July 31, 2005:

- 1. We have added 20 new members to our flock and lost 4, giving us a net gain of 16.
- 2. We have seen an increase in attendance at our Divine Services, averaging approximately 75 per Sunday.
- 3. We have seen an increase in attendance at Adult Bible Class on Sunday mornings, averaging over 30 per Sunday.
- 4. We renovated our office space, resulting in a new pastor's office, a new church office, and a more organized sacristy (which also serves as overflow space).
- 5. We completed the sale of the parsonage on Glencoe using the proceeds to establish a Building Fund.
- 6. We purchased, thanks to a couple of

- generous donations, a new copy machine.
- 7. We were able to pre-order, thanks again to a generous donation, 100 new LSB hymnals and all the necessary resources.
- 8. We added lighting inside our sanctuary and around the church grounds using the Building Fund and a generous donation.
- 9. We purchased new furnaces and added central air throughout our building using our Building Fund.
- 10. We established a new evangelism committee named S.A.L.T., which has already been, and will continue to be, a tremendous blessing to our congregation and to our community (e.g. the Easter Egg Hunt sponsored by S.A.L.T. brought over 300 guests to our congregation).
- 11. We began a Secret Pals program.
- 12. We began a "Cookie Connection" ministry for our first-time guests (established by S.A.L.T.).
- 13. We established a Tuesday morning Bible Study called "Together in the Word" and have averaged approximately 13 attendees, with as many as 26 in attendance.
- 14. We established a website for our congregation.
- 15. We revised and improved our monthly congregational newsletter, naming it *The Peace Post*.
- 16. We increased the visibility of our elders by giving them additional duties during our Services and calling upon them to lead Services in the pastor's absence.
- 17. We have greatly expanded our

The story revolves around Cass's mom marrying a man with a daughter of his own and moving from Tennessee to an island in the Pacific Ocean. The second series is by Dandi Daly Mackall and is about the life of a girl who talks to horses. In the first book, "Horsefeathers", she has to save the farm and by using prayer and some 'horse-sense' she does just that.
- YOUNG CHILDREN—A series of books written by Dan Carr & Susan K. Leigh specifically for elementary children. The "God, I Need to Talk About..." books are small but compact. 

#### ORGAN WORKSHOP—CONCORDIA THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY, FORT WAYNE, IN

July 17-21, 2006

Thank you to Peace congregation for the opportunity to attend the organ workshop this year. It was an intense study of theology in music, and in playing of hymns.

Theology classes were for an hour each day with Professor Masaki. The rest of the daily classes were spent in Kramer Chapel working on the chapel organ with Kantor Hildebrand.

Theology classes consisted of a study of the history of Lutheran hymns, Luther's writings on worship, what comprises our divine services; and the role of the pastoral office, church musicians and laypersons in that all are instruments of God in the furtherance of His kingdom. Professor Masaki summarized his presentation with emphasis on giving and receiving. God gives to us in the Divine Service; we receive, and we give back to Him and to each other by the fruit of the lips and fruit of the spirit.

In Kantor Hildebrand's classes we were taught how to improvise (in essence, the writing of music) the music we see on the page in our hymnal, to be used for hymn introductions, offertories, and even preludes and postludes.

The on-campus life was also a big part of our week. Matins every morning at 7:10 am were done with no accompaniment on organ (a capella) to the Morning Daily Prayer, Hymnal Supplement p. 29. Morning chapel at 10:30 used LW Office of Matins, Hymnal Supplement Psalms, LW Morning Prayer and TLH Office of Matins. On Wednesday, a communion service was used and it was magnificent! Brought tears to my eyes. These services can be heard on the CTS website at <a href="http://www.ctsfw.edu/audio.php">http://www.ctsfw.edu/audio.php</a> -- they are posted daily and are retained for about 2 weeks. An afternoon service at 3:30 was the Vespers service, again done without any organ. Chapel services are very inspirational and spirit-filled. One really feels the presence of God. As someone said, "It is like going to the Mountain," and "It is the closest thing to heaven on earth I have experienced."

It was a wonderful week of working with fellow Lutheran church musicians, learning from Professor Masaki, Kantor Hildebrand, and each other.

The church organist only knows how you feel about the music and how the music enhances your worship in our divine services when and if you talk with us. Please let us know.

Thank you, and may God bless our worship always.

Summary Minutes, Church Council Meeting, July 10, 2006

**Secretary's Report**: Minutes of the June 12 meeting were approved.

#### Pastor's Report:

- 1. Official acts: John Row and Amanda Richardson confirmed June 18, 2006. They will be married at Peace on July 22.
- 2. Time in Hamburg was a blessing. Al will be installed this Sunday (July 16), Pastor will be at the installation. Elders will lead service at Peace.
- 3. District Convention was last week of June. Pastor wrote about that meeting in the July newsletter.
- 4. Christian Education: We will continue to discuss the pastoral epistles in Adult Bible Class for a few weeks and will begin Revelation in the Fall. Together in the Word will not meet in July.
- 5. S.A.L.T. will meet on July 11. They will be doing an evangelism walk, will be participating in Relay for Life and will also advertise a Christianity 101 course.
- 6. Table Talk will be July 21 at 8:00 pm at Pastor's house around the campfire.
- 7. Pastor will be on vacation July 24-29.

#### Elder's Report: None

#### Board of Christian Ed. Report:

VBS started today. Things went well, however we wish we had more children.

#### Ladies Guild Report:

- 1. Guild is purchasing a new first aid kit. The kit is now very up-to-date.
- We will pay to have the flagon from our communion ware set re-plated. Ladies Guild also suggests purchasing two new chalices and a host box.
- 3. We are having coffee hostesses during the summer.

#### **Trustees Report:**

Lighting and air conditioning are complete.

#### **Treasurers Report:**

We are about \$10,000 behind in giving this year and spending at the budgeted amount.

#### **Old Business:**

- 1. Stained glass windows: Mr. Handley came to the church two weeks ago to take measurements and said he would be working on the windows soon. We will review the drawings and ok them before the work begins.
- 2. Constitutional Committee: Vern has a copy of the guidelines for congregational constitutions and by-laws from the LCMS. The committee will consist of the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Pastor. We also need a budget and finance committee to give input to the treasurer.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Down payment assistance loan for the purchase of Pastor Messer's home:
  - The congregation has paid the first year of the down payment assistance loan. Jon suggested making a decision about what we will do in the second year. This is a ten year loan.
  - Bill Brostrom moved that we forgive the first year of the down payment assistance loan and that similar consideration take place each year at the July Council meeting. Burt Henry seconded. Motion carried. Decision will be reported at the July Voter's Meeting.

- 19. We have recently established a Constitutional Committee, the purpose of which will be to update and revise our Constitution and Bylaws, bringing them up to date and providing a clearer structure to our congregation's organization, structure, and governance.
- 20. We introduced a few new fellowship opportunities, including *Table Talk*, *Progressive Dinner*, and *Peace Movie Nights*, adding to our already established *Euchre Night* and *Dinners for 6-7-8*.
- 21. We developed a beautiful new church logo to give our congregation its own personal identity.
- 22. We are in the process of putting together a new adult choir.

23. We are in the process of establishing a ministry by which members other than the pastor will visit our shut-ins and members who are sick and/or hospitalized.

As you can see, we have, by God's grace, already accomplished a great deal in our first year together.
